EDTE 620 INTRODUCTION TO SPECIAL EDUCATION: BC CASE RESOURCE TEACHER LEARNING SERIES

Teachers who have completed the BC CASE Modules independent of VIU under the supervision of a BC CASE facilitator (and have received certificates of completion), and register for the Special Education Diploma Program will be eligible to receive equivalency credit for EDTE 620. Completion of the CASE modules makes up the main part of the work that needs to be done towards EDTE 620. Once completed, students may apply to VIU for a Prior Learning Assessment for course credit. A VIU instructor will be assigned to review all modules work submitted, as well as provide an additional culminating assignment to complete the EDTE 620 requirements.
